Subject: Revision of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Post-M Scholarship for students belonging to OBCs (PMS-OBC).

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The Government of India has been implementing the Scheme of Pc Scholarship to students belonging to OBCs since 1998. It aims to provide assistance to students belonging to OBCs for pursuing post-matriculation courses recognized institutions. Under the Scheme, Central Assistance is provided on 100 to all States/UTs over and above their respective "committed liability" except in the North Eastern States, which are exempted from committed liability.

Components of the Scheme include:

(i) maintenance allowance.

(ii) reimbursement of non-refundable compulsory fee charged by ed institutions; and

(iii) certain other allowances

The Scheme has now been revised w.e.f. 01.07.2011. The revision constant the following -

The Scheme was, to begin with, meant to be open-ended but has, in probeen implemented subject to allocation available for it. This "Funds-Li nature is now being formalized, as per details given in para 5 below.

#### 10. IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES

The scheme is being implemented/funded by Ministry of Minority Affairs through the States/UT's Administration.

#### CONDITIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIP 11.

- Scholarship will be awarded to the students studying in Classes XI and XII (i) including technical and vocational courses of this level including Polytechnics, ITIs, and other courses.
- An Income Certificate, issued from a Competent Authority in the State/UT (ii)Governments is required in respect of parent/guardian of the student. (iii)
- A Self-Certified Community Certificate is required from the student who has attained 18 years of age. For others the Community Certificate certified by parent/guardian of the student is required.
- The continuance of award (for Renewal applicants) will be subject to (iv)securing 50% marks in the previous year's examination (provided the students pursues the same course and same Institute/School). (v)
- Maintenance allowance will be provided to hostellers and day scholars.
- Scholarship will not be given to more than two students from a family (applicable (vi) for all Scholarship schemes meant for minorities under this Ministry taken together).
- Students should be regular in attendance for which the yardstick will be decided (vii) by the competent authority of the school.
- The school/institute will certify the claim of student of being an outstation student (viii) not residing in hostel of the school/institute concerned on the basis of permanent address and parents' address.
- Migration of students from one school/institute to another is not allowed for (ix)renewal applicants during the period of academic course.
- If a student violates school discipline or any other terms and conditions of the (x)scholarship, scholarship may be suspended or cancelled. The State Government/Union Territory Administration can also directly cancel the award if duly satisfied of the reasons of violation of these regulations governing the
- If a student is found to have obtained a scholarship by false statement, his/her (xi)scholarship will be cancelled forthwith and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered by the concerned State/UT Govt. (iix)
- The course/tuition fees and maintenance allowancewill be credited to the student's account directly under Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode.
- The student obtaining benefits under this scheme shall not be allowed to avail of (xiii) benefits under any other scheme for this purpose. (xiv)
- A student shall be eligible for only one scholarship out of all the available Scholarships of Central Government meant for SC/ST/OBC/ minority. (XV)



## Note 1: Commercial Pilot License Course (CPL)

CPL course would include Commercial Helicopter Pilot License (CHPL) and multi-engine rating training on A-320 and similar aircrafts even after the candidate has got scholarship for multi-engine rating training with the CPL course. CPL course is covered under Group 'P. The number of awards for CPL will be 50 per analm. Consequent upon receiving applications from concerned students, concerned State Governments/UT Admis, should scrittinize them for determining their eligibility under the scheme and the number of eligible applicants for CPL training (with their



Only in the case where both the parents (or husband in the case of married but unemployed girl student) have died, the income of the guardian who is supporting the student in his/her studies has to be taken. Such students whose parent's income is affected due to unfortunate death of one of earning parents and resultantly comes within the income ceiling prescribed under the scheme, shall become eligible for scholarship, subject to their fulfilling other conditions of eligibility, from the month in which such sad incidence takes place. Applications for scholarships from such students can be considered even after lapse of last date of receipt of applications, on compassionate grounds.

NOTE 2: House rent allowance received by the parents of a student shall be exempted from the computation of 'income' if the same has been permitted to be exempted for the

NOTE 3: Income certificate is required to be taken once only i.e. at the time of admission to courses which are continuing for more than one year.

NOTE 4: The revised income ceiling has been further upgraded, after taking into account Consumer Price Index for Industrial workers upto October 2009. Income Ceiling would be revised once in every two years linking it with Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers for the month of October of the year, preceding the year of revision and will be
